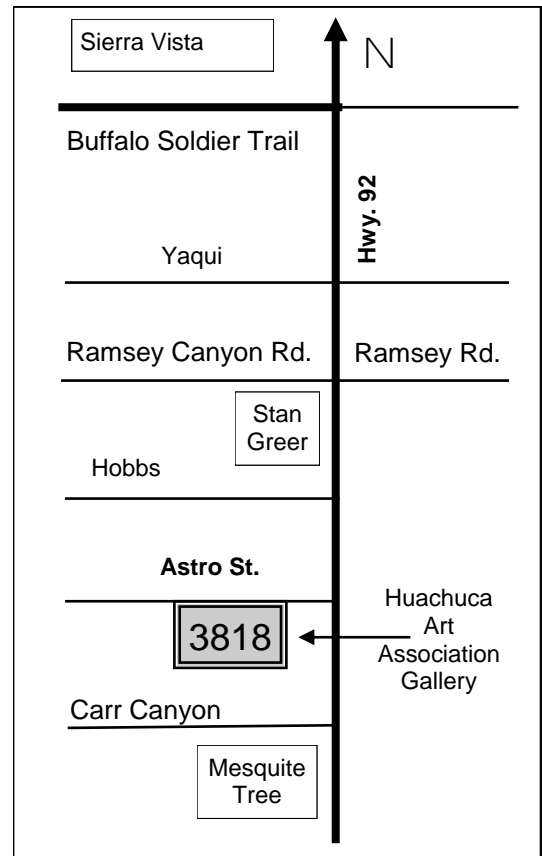

Katherine Baccaro, a native of Brooklyn, New York, keeps Brooklyn in her heart and in her accent. On her departure from the borough she went to Brown University where she spent four very positive years. She studied Spanish with the intention of becoming a business translator but she loved to write. Though the translator idea was more practical, she soon switched to a writing major. At Brown this was called English Expression. Shortly after graduation she won a prestigious writing fellowship from the Eugene F. Saxton Memorial Trust for a novel never (yet) completed. It was a heady honor, but it did not pay the rent.

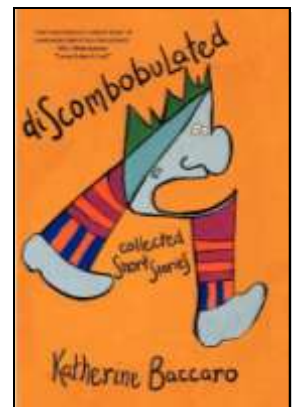
Commercially speaking the English Expression major was not good for much so she returned to Brooklyn and began teaching on the elementary school level. She applied to the Department of Defense for a teaching job abroad. She was assigned to England where she lived in a windmill and spent two of the happiest years of her life, but she still had the travel bug. Her next assignment was to Brindisi, Italy, a short but fortunate experience followed by an assignment to Livorno, Italy, where she stuck for thirteen years.

The DoD program offered many wonderful opportunities for travel and Baccaro was next offered a post in Korea where she spent several years, first in Osan, then in Seoul where she got to taste again the joys of life in a big city.

After that Baccaro was lucky enough to get a position in Adana, Turkey. Turkey was a wonderful place, full of antiquities and friendly people until war intervened. The Gulf War was so near that all civilians were evacuated to the United States.

There was no more home in Brooklyn so she decided to repair to Sierra Vista, Arizona where she had a good friend with whom she could wait out the evacuation. After three months she decided to go house hunting, just for fun. She found a house and bought it for eventual retirement.

So here she is, happily indulging her desire to write and paint.

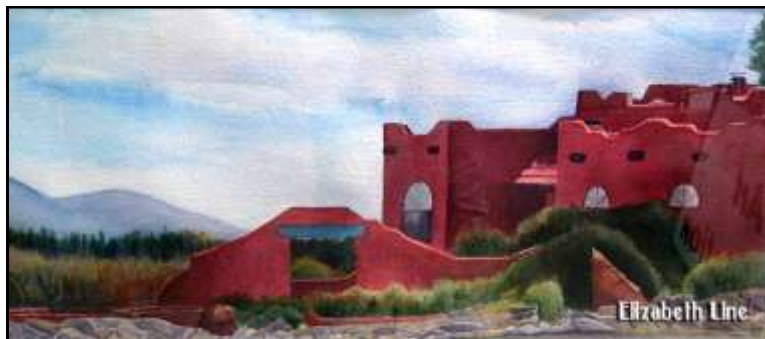

Paper Arts Group

Yolande Adriaanse brought a lot of her "goodies" to our second meeting of Paper Arts so that we could decorate paper and use it on small boxes. (The "goodies" also included See's Chocolates to put in the boxes...yummy!!!)

Six other members were elbow deep in glaze, paint and tools just 5 minutes after everything was set up.

Two layers of paint were laid down on the paper sample. Experimenting with masking tape and various tools to mark designs on the paper, we worked quickly since the paint dried very fast. After those layers dried we mixed another color with glaze (can be purchased at Home Depot) and laid it down to create some very interesting effects.

Yolande had a tool to cut out the box form in gold card stock. We then used some of our decorated papers to decorate the sides of the box.

Thank you, Yolande for such an interesting and productive 2 hours. We all had a wonderful time.

Not only the usual line-up of art classes, demos and open studio days, we hosted the Domestic Violence Center's women's group. The ladies came for an evening workshop on using the art of 'Zentangling' for its meditative therapeutic value. They each received hand made gift bags filled with art supplies and a chocolate truffle (what better way to feel special and soothed than with chocolate). The act of drawing deliberate strokes, working in set patterns and focusing on our process was calming of our stressed minds and bodies.

One way to equate this time of meditating on our art work is like giving a muscle a chance to relax from its strained hard work. When we relax and take time to clear our minds with the drawing patterns, we can return to our lives and are able to tackle stresses with renewed energy and clear thinking. The Zentangle method was so easy to learn and accomplish that the ladies were excited to take the method back to teach others at the DV Center.

Georgia McKellar and Sherry Harig, both HAA Board Members, partnered up to present a "Poetry and Painting" Workshop for ALL of Georgia's high school English class students. On Thursday Georgia presented the poetry writing challenge based on paint sample chips from the local paint store. The chips come with not only the energetic colors, but they had fun names, such as a warm orange named 'Pumpkin Butter'. By the end of the class they had a poem written and ready for the next days painting session. The HAA art program provided the supplies and instructor Sherry to present the painting of a visual communication exercise based on the students poems. 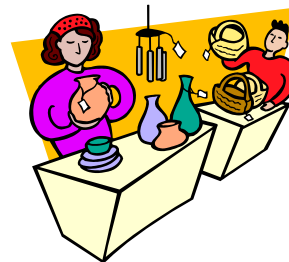
as we took it step by step she would comment 'I DID it!' I will miss their enthusiasm and creative art works. Best of luck in your new home in Hawaii kids.

In conjunction with Bisbee Pride, on Saturday, June 18, 2011 there will be an artisan fair in Grassy Park in front of the

Museum The show will feature **artisan and non-profit information booths and space is LIMITED so register soon!** The **artisan fair will be open at 10am and will close at 6:00pm. Vendor spaces will be marked** the day of the event prior to 8:00am Saturday morning. **Set up must be completed by 10 am Saturday morning** – you may arrive as early as 8:00 am. Please note that there is no loading/unloading zone so you will be asked to quickly unload your vehicles and park before beginning set up. **Tear down will begin 6pm – no one is allowed to leave early as this disrupts other vendor's sales.** Standard booth spaces are available for **\$40 per 10' x 10' space and \$25 for a table space (table and chairs to be provided by vendor).** Spaces are limited so vendors are encouraged to share. **Artisans must provide their own awnings, tables and chairs.** Awnings must be a MAXIMUM of 10"x 10" for booth spaces and large umbrellas may be used for table spaces. 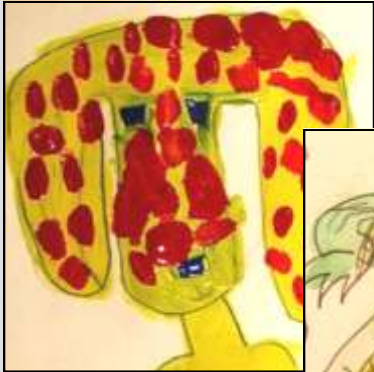

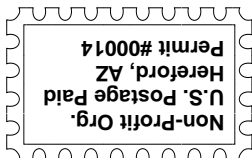
