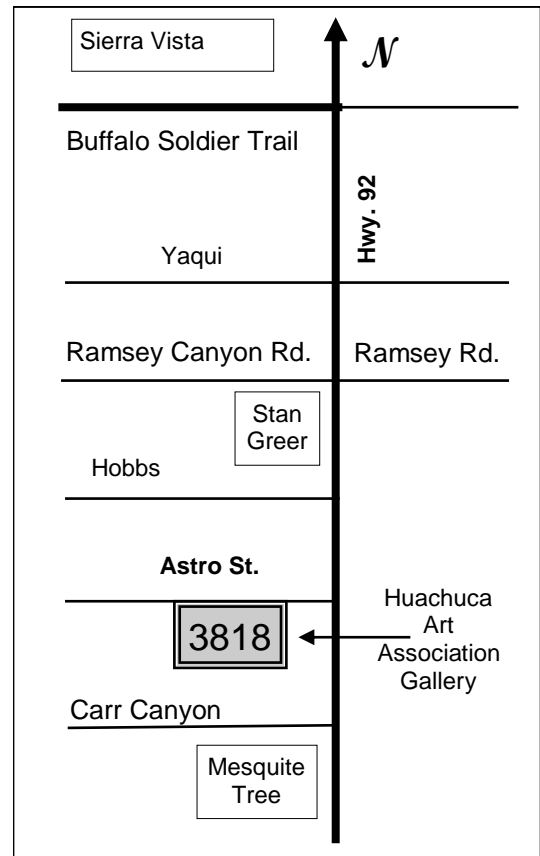
At the Mall in Sierra Vista, 2200 El Mercado Loop

This is a non-judged show open to HAA members for the displaying of crafts including: illustrated books, jewelry, pottery, leather work, fabric weaving, sculpture and other 3-dimensional works, photography and paintings including bin items, etc. All work must be original creations by the artist. No copies from magazines, books, online images, or photographs (other than photographs taken by the artist unless submitting artist has written permission from the copyright owner). No work done from kits will be accepted. Fee is \$40.00 for up to 20 pieces, a limit of five framed paintings per artist. All sold items, including framed paintings, may be replaced during the show. A 20 percent commission will be retained by the Huachuca Art Association. Each artist or their replacement must document the show, sign up on day of delivery. This is a two-month show; artist may need to sit two to three times during this period. Applications can be found at www.huachuca-art.com.

Tips for Plein-Air Painting

Plein Air is a French term meaning "open air." Plein-Air painting is basically painting outdoors. Some artists who are renowned for this technique are Claude Monet and Pierre-Auguste Renoir who were French Impressionist painting masters. Modern day artists today still use this technique. In fact, many professional painters go out together in nature together in early mornings and catch the colors of the sunrise. This helps inform the colors they use in future paintings. These types of sessions frequently last the entire day. When it comes to plein-air painting as a whole, there are some points to keep in mind for the ultimate success and enjoyment.

1. Weather and Apparel: When painting outside, be sure to dress in the appropriate layers. After all, weather conditions do change rapidly at times. Protection from the sun is also really important. Use a good sunscreen and apply it regularly throughout the day. Consider wearing a brimmed hat. You might also think about wearing pants with shorts underneath for those unexpected weather chances. Same goes for t-shirts and long sleeves.
2. Painting Supplies: Typically, pan-type watercolors are the best type of paints for plein-air painting. They are easy to work with and tend to dry fairly quickly. It is recommended to bring along paint cups as opposed to tube paints because these become covered with a thin skin when they begin to dry out. Cups can be capped and used easily at later dates. Be sure to supply yourself or your group with a container for water and brush cleaning. You also want to get yourself a small fold-up stool. Make sure it's light weight and comfortable for all day sitting. Be sure to bring extra clothes, brushes, towels, and plastic bags as well.
3. Easels: Easels come in all shapes and forms. They can come as a suitcase or include a tripod with a supportive H-shaped frame. You probably want to purchase a plein-air easel case that will conveniently store your canvasses, your paints, and your other materials. When you are choosing an easel be sure that it's collapsible, easy to transport, and that is as light weight as possible.



The will to create and the will to love is one. Art makes love visible, and by doing so it uplifts and heals, because in the presence of love everything is healed. Creative artists just need to express freely what they see through their loving inner eyes without keeping anything hidden or suppressed. The French sculptor Auguste Rodin (1840-1917) said, "I see all the truth, and not only that of the outside. I accentuate the lines which best express the spiritual state that I interpret." If we cannot envision a better world, we cannot create one. If the spiritual is not known to an artist, then what that artist shows in their art is a representation of what is either unknown or what is a lie. The artist, Andrew Wyeth (1917-2009), said in a Life magazine interview in 1956: "Really I think one art goes only as far and as deep as your love goes." 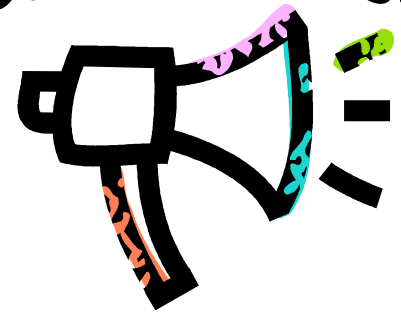
The Gathering will feature entertainment by the group Contra Swings. Complimentary hors d'oeuvres are available and there will

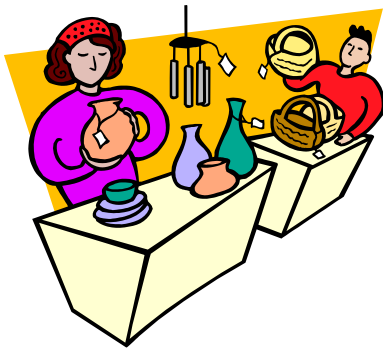

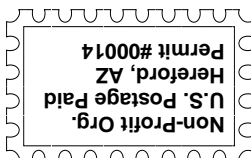
